# Ward profile introduction


### **About Lewisham's Ward profiles**

The ward profiles bring together some of the key data sources to provide the demographic, social and economic characteristics of an area. In May 2022, the number of wards increased from 18 to 19.

- The boundaries of two wards have stayed the same, Telegraph Hill and Forest Hill, all the others changed.
- Two wards no longer exists: New Cross and Whitefoot.
- We now have three brand new wards: Deptford, Hither Green and New Cross Gate.
- · 16 wards have three Councillors.
- Three wards have only two Councillors: Bellingham, Lewisham Central and New Cross Gate.
- The total number of Councillors remained in 54, the same as the previous period.

At the time of publication, the results of the 2021 Census have not yet been published, which means many indicator variables in this report rely on potentially outdated data from the 2011 Census. Data sources of all charts and statistics are clearly stated throughout this document. Revised data will be made available in the next revision of this document.

# **Evelyn**

With significant levels of housing development in the area, Evelyn ward had new boundaries established in May 2022, reducing its size to reflect the increased number of residents in the immediate area.

Lewisham Homes is the main social landlord and works widely across the ward. There are a range of established Tenant and Resident Associations, as well as EveRest who seek to bring them together. There is one community centre (2000 Community Action Centre) who work with organisations such as Bench Outreach, Lewisham Refugee and Migrant Network and XLP to provide services such as a community store, advice and support, and activities for families and young people. Riverside Youth Club, overseen by Youth First is within the ward and funding has been identified for development works which are planned in 2022.

In recent years, there has been significant focus on developing green spaces and play opportunities for families and young people (as well as cycling infrastructure) by organisations like Deptford Folk and Evelyn Parents Forum. These priorities have been partially addressed via NCIL where significant investment will be made in the 2022-24 programme.


Levels of child poverty are amongst the highest in the borough and work continues to support existing residents, many of whom are in social housing, and to integrate residents who are new to the area.

There is a strong voluntary/community sector presence in Evelyn ward.

There are also a large number of community groups such as Pepys Community Forum and Deptford Working Histories, working on protecting and enhancing the cultural heritage of the area including the strong naval heritage, and that of notable figures who lived or were connected to the area.

In Evelyn ward £691,020 was awarded in NCIL funding to 19 projects (within the old ward boundaries). Ward NCIL priorities included Open/green spaces and nature; Transport and streets; Community facilities; Air quality and Community safety. Previous ward priorities included support for children and young people. The NCIL funded projects include significant spending on local parks and green spaces, improved play space, and a number of projects supporting families and young people such as stay and play activities, vocational training and dedicated youth workers.

# **Population**

Evelyn has an estimated population of **14,506 residents**, which makes it one of the smaller constituencies in the borough (rank 16 of 19 wards.)

Among its residents, **49.2% identify as female**, and **50.8% as male**. Unfortunately, ONS population statistics do not include estimates for nonbinary gender identities.

The **average age in Evelyn is 33**, compared to 36 in Lewisham as a whole, and 37 in London. This makes it one of the youngest wards in the borough.


In terms of its geographic area, at 1.3 km<sup>2</sup> it is one of the smallest wards in the borough (rank 16 of 19.)

As to its population density, at 11,100 people per km<sup>2</sup> it is among the most densely populated wards in the borough (rank 4 of 19.)


# Diversity: Ethnicity and religion

### **Ethnicity**

26.7% of Evelyn residents have an ethnicity of White British (White English, Welsh, Scottish, or Northern Irish), compared to 41.5% in Lewisham as a whole, 44.9% in London, and 79.8% in England.

Among those not White British, the three most common ethnicities are Black African (22.0%), White Other (13.8%), and Black Caribbean (7.7%).






### Religion

**52.7% of Evelyn residents identify as Christian**, compared to 52.8% in Lewisham as a whole, 48.4% in London, and 59.4% in England. Among those not identifying as Christian, the three most common religions are No Religion (24.1%), Muslim (9.4%), and Not Stated (7.6%).

### Religion and beliefs in Evelyn, ONS Census 2011






# **Diversity: Country of birth**


**51.2% of Evelyn residents were born in England**, compared to 64.0% in Lewisham as a whole, 61.1% in London, and 83.5% in England.

Among those not born in England, the three most common countries of birth are Nigeria (5.2%), Jamaica (2.4%), and Poland (2.0%).





# Country of birth (excluding England) in Evelyn, ONS Census 2011






# **Diversity: Languages**

**73.3% of Evelyn residents speak English as their primary language**, compared to 83.5% in Lewisham as a whole, 77.9% in London, and 92.0% in England.

Of the remaining residents, 22.2% can speak English well or very well.




Population speaking little or no English in Evelyn, ONS Census 2011



On the other hand, 4.5% of residents cannot speak English well or at all, compared to a Lewisham average of 3.1%. This means an estimated 652 people in Evelyn may require everyday language support.

Among those not speaking English as their main language, the three most widely spoken languages are French (2.7%), All other Chinese (1.9%), and Polish (1.8%).








# **Deprivation**


The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) is the official measure of relative deprivation in England. It is based on multiple factors: population income, employment, education skills and training, health and disability, crime, barriers to housing and services, and general living environment.

The IMD is determined for small areas, using a statistical geography called Lower-layer Super Output Areas (LSOA), with each LSOA typically representing between 1,000 and 3,000 people. Each LSOA in England is ranked from most deprived to least deprived, and then segmented into ten groups (or deciles), with the bottom decile (or decile 1) representing the most deprived 10% LSOAs in England.

# **Fuel poverty and EPC**

Fuel poverty in England is measured statistically using the Low Income High Costs definition, under which a household is considered to be in fuel poverty if:

- They have required fuel costs that above average (the national median spend on fuel).
- Were they to spend that amount they would be left with a residual income below the official poverty line.


In the six LSOAs in Evelyn, proportion of households fuel poor ranges from 10.9% to 17.4%.

Energy Performance Certificates (EPCs) were first introduced in England and Wales in 2007, and are valid for 10 years. They contain information about a property's energy use and typical energy costs, and recommendations about how to reduce energy use and save money. Dwellings are rated between A (highly energy efficient) and G (highly inefficient.) The average EPC rating for dwellings in England is D.

In Evelyn, 68% of assessed households have received an EPC rating of A, B, or C, which means they are highly energy-efficient.

It is estimated that the share of highly energy-efficient dwellings in Evelyn could be as high as 90% if home owners were to carry out the improvements recommended during their assessment.




# Housing and affordability


**79.9% of Evelyn residents live in flats**, compared to 55.4% in Lewisham as a whole, 52.2% in London, and 22.1% in England. Among Evelyn residents, the three most common accommodation types are Flats (79.9%), Terraced (14.2%), and Semi-detached houses (4.4%).

**52.4% of Evelyn residents live in social rented accommodation**, compared to 31.1% in Lewisham as a whole, 24.1% in London, and 17.7% in England. Among Evelyn residents, the three most common types of tenure are Social rented (52.4%), Private rented (24.4%), and Owned (18.6%).

House prices in Lewisham remain lower than those for London as a whole. In 2020, the median house price in the borough was £430,000 compared with £483,000 for Greater London and £249,000 for England.

In terms of relative affordability based on median prices, Lewisham had a median work-place based income to house price ratio in 2020 of 12.3x. Based on median ratios, Lewisham was relatively more affordable than Lambeth, Greenwich and Bromley; and less affordable than Southwark, Croydon, Tower Hamlets and London overall, the South East region and England.

# Household composition

Of Evelyn's households in 2011, 36% were one person households, 43.6% were families and 20.3% other household types, compared to a Lewisham average composition of 34.1% one person household, 51.3% families and 14.4% other household types.






# **Employment**

In the 2011 Census, the unemployment rate in Evelyn was 7.6% among residents aged 16-74, compared to a Lewisham average of 6.3%. 27.3% of residents are not economically active, for example because they are in education, looking after home or family, long-term sick or disabled, or in retirement.

The three most common occupations in Evelyn are Professional occupations (19.4%), Elementary occupations (15.7%), and Associate professional and technical occupations (15.2%).


## **Benefit claimants**

Universal Credit is the primary social security payment for working-age people with a low household income. It was introduced in 2013 and has gradually replaced six prior benefits: income-based Employment and Support Allowance, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, and Income Support; Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit; and Housing Benefit.


All Universal Credit recipients receive a standard payment that varies by age and whether they live with a partner. Additional payments are offered to help with housing, children and childcare, sickness and disability, and for carers. A further weekly £20 uplift was offered during the COVID-19 pandemic until September 2021.

In Evelyn, 1,752 people received Universal Credit in February 2022. By comparison, in February 2020, 730 people received Universal Credit.


# Health and wellbeing

Census captures different metrics related to a self-assessment of health which can be a useful indicator of the population's general wellbeing and health-related quality of life. These include general health, day-to-day activities limited, and provision of unpaid care.


The average rate of Evelyn residents in very good/good health is 84% compared to a Lewisham average of 81% and a national average of 83%.

Around 6.1% residents of Evelyn had a long term health problem or disability limiting their day to day activities a lot compared to a Lewisham average of 7% and a national average of 8.3%.

### Day-to-day activities limited in Evelyn, ONS Census 2011








Around 6.6% of residents in Evelyn provided unpaid care compared to a Lewisham average of 8.1% and a national average of 10.1%.




# Health and life expectancy


The average life expectancy at birth for females in Evelyn is 83.7 years compared to England average of 83.2.


### Air quality

per cubic metre of air.


Air quality in Evelyn, London Atmospheric Emissions Inventory (LAEI), 2019


This model from 2019 estimates levels based on historical readings at sensor sites, interpolated across the whole of Greater London.

The three most common types of car or van availability in Evelyn are no cars or vans (61.5%), one car or van (32.9%), and two cars or vans (4.6%).








## Education

### **Educational attainment**

There are nine qualification levels in England: Entry level and then levels 1-9. Levels 1-2 cover GCSE and equivalents, Level 3 covers A level and equivalents, and Levels 4-8 cover higher education equivalents.

In Evelyn, 18% of residents have no qualifications; 11% have Level 1 qualifications; 12% have Level 2 qualifications; 1% have Apprenticeship; 10% have Level 3 qualifications; and 36% have Level 4 qualifications and above.





### **OFSTED Ratings**

This section provides general information on schools located in the ward and their OFSTED ratings.

Ofsted is the Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills. They inspect services providing education and skills for learners of all ages. They also inspect and regulate services that care for children and young people.

Out of three schools in Evelyn, three are rated as Good.




## **Crime**


In the period January-December 2021, the number of recorded crimes in Lewisham was 25692 (excluding sexual offences).

Of 874 recorded crimes (Home Office crime classifications, excluding sexual offences) in Evelyn, the three most common offences include violence against the person (252), theft (145) and burglary (140).

In the six LSOAs in Evelyn, overall crime rates per 1,000 people range from 50.9 to 70.2.


# Residents survey

Due to limited data from Lewisham Residents' Survey 2021 at ward level, survey results included in this document are presented at the borough level.

### **Satisfaction with the Council**

Over two thirds (69%) of residents are satisfied with the way Lewisham Council runs things, whilst around 11% are dissatisfied. Satisfaction in Lewisham is significantly higher when compared with LGA October 2021 National data (56%; 13 percentage points).


# Satisfaction with how Lewisham Council runs things, Lewisham Residents' Survey 2021



### Satisfaction local area

The majority of residents (79%) are satisfied with their local area as a place to live, whilst around 8% are dissatisfied. Satisfaction is slightly higher when compared with LGA October 2021 National data (78%; 1 percentage points).
