
About Lewisham's Ward profiles

The ward profiles bring together some of the key data sources to provide the demographic, social and economic characteristics of an area. In May 2022, the number of wards increased from 18 to 19.

- The boundaries of two wards have stayed the same, Telegraph Hill and Forest Hill, all the others changed.
- Two wards no longer exists: New Cross and Whitefoot.
- We now have three brand new wards: Deptford, Hither Green and New Cross Gate.
- 16 wards have three Councillors.
- Three wards have only two Councillors: Bellingham, Lewisham Central and New Cross Gate.
- The total number of Councillors remained in 54, the same as the previous period.

At the time of publication, the results of the 2021 Census have not yet been published, which means many indicator variables in this report rely on potentially outdated data from the 2011 Census. Data sources of all charts and statistics are clearly stated throughout this document. Revised data will be made available in the next revision of this document.

Lee Green

Lee Green ward boundary remains unchanged following the ward boundary established in May 2022. The ward borders onto Blackheath to the north, Grove Park, Hither Green and to a section of the Royal Borough of Greenwich (Kidbrooke and Horn Park).

The Chiltonian Industrial Estate is home to many renowned commercial businesses. There are also a variety of shops along Lee High Road, Staplehurst Road, Burnt Ash Road and Burnt Ash Hill including a large Sainsbury's store.

Lee Green has a number of green spaces including the Manor House Gardens, Manor Park and Edith Nesbit Gardens.


The Lee Manor Conservation area was designated in 1975 and consists of a variety of mainly two storey terraced residential housing built on land owned by the Baring Family in 1860s. This conservation area covers Micheldever Road, Handen Road etc.

Clarion Housing Group is the main social landlord, managing homes on the two main social housing estate (Leybrigde and Newstead Estates). Other social landlords covering the area include Peabody and London and Quadrant Group.

Lee Green has a range of well-established amenities groups who seek to protect and enhance the cultural heritage of the area promoting community cohesion i.e. (Lee Green Lives, Lee Manor Society, Friends of Manor House Gardens, Friends of Manor House Library, Friends and Users of Staplehurst Shops (FUSS – now in the new Hither Green ward) etc.

In Lee Green ward £39,349 was awarded in NCIL funding to eight projects which included, greening projects such as tree planting and updating planters, improved local facilities at Manor House Library, community support and events such as the Lee Green Consortium, Lee Fair Share and the FUSS Christmas Fair. A project to look at travel safety has also been jointly funded with Grove Park ward.

Population

Lee Green has an estimated population of **16,080 residents** (rank 12 of 19 wards.)

Among its residents, **48.8% identify as female**, and **51.2% as male**. Unfortunately, ONS population statistics do not include estimates for nonbinary gender identities.

The **average age in Lee Green is 37**, compared to 36 in Lewisham as a whole, and 37 in London. This makes it one of the oldest wards in the borough.




Diversity: Ethnicity and religion

Ethnicity

54.1% of Lee Green residents have an ethnicity of White British (White English, Welsh, Scottish, or Northern Irish), compared to 41.5% in Lewisham as a whole, 44.9% in London, and 79.8% in England.

Among those not White British, the three most common ethnicities are White Other (10.0%), Black Caribbean (7.5%), and Black African (6.1%).

Ethnicity (excluding White British) in Lee Green, ONS Census 2011



Religion and beliefs in Lee Green, ONS Census 2011







Diversity: Country of birth


68.4% of Lee Green residents were born in England, compared to 64.0% in Lewisham as a whole, 61.1% in London, and 83.5% in England.

Among those not born in England, the three most common countries of birth are Jamaica (2.4%), Nigeria (2.2%), and Ireland (1.6%).





Country of birth (excluding England) in Lee Green, ONS Census 2011






Diversity: Languages

85.2% of Lee Green residents speak English as their primary language, compared to 83.5% in Lewisham as a whole, 77.9% in London, and 92.0% in England.

Of the remaining residents, 12.3% can speak English well or very well.



Population speaking little or no English in Lee Green, ONS Census 2011




On the other hand, 2.5% of residents cannot speak English well or at all, compared to a Lewisham average of 3.1%. This means an estimated 400 people in Lee Green may require everyday language support.

Among those not speaking English as their main language, the three most widely spoken languages are Polish (1.4%), Tamil (1.2%), and French (1.1%).








Deprivation

The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) is the official measure of relative deprivation in England. It is based on multiple factors: population income, employment, education skills and training, health and disability, crime, barriers to housing and services, and general living environment.


The IMD is determined for small areas, using a statistical geography called Lower-layer Super Output Areas (LSOA), with each LSOA typically representing between 1,000 and 3,000 people. Each LSOA in England is ranked from most deprived to least deprived, and then segmented into ten groups (or deciles), with the bottom decile (or decile 1) representing the most deprived 10% LSOAs in England.

Of the eight LSOAs in Lee Green, zero rank in the bottom 20% of the country (decile 1 or 2.)

Fuel poverty and EPC

Fuel poverty in England is measured statistically using the Low Income High Costs definition, under which a household is considered to be in fuel poverty if:

- They have required fuel costs that above average (the national median spend on fuel).
- Were they to spend that amount they would be left with a residual income below the official poverty line.


In the eight LSOAs in Lee Green, proportion of households fuel poor ranges from 12% to 18%.

Energy Performance Certificates (EPCs) were first introduced in England and Wales in 2007, and are valid for 10 years. They contain information about a property's energy use and typical energy costs, and recommendations about how to reduce energy use and save money. Dwellings are rated between A (highly energy efficient) and G (highly inefficient.) The average EPC rating for dwellings in England is D.

In Lee Green, 38% of assessed households have received an EPC rating of A, B, or C, which means they are highly energy-efficient.

It is estimated that the share of highly energy-efficient dwellings in Lee Green could be as high as 82% if home owners were to carry out the improvements recommended during their assessment.




Housing and affordability


48.3% of Lee Green residents live in flats, compared to 55.4% in Lewisham as a whole, 52.2% in London, and 22.1% in England. Among Lee Green residents, the three most common accommodation types are Flats (48.3%), Terraced (34.1%), and Semi-detached houses (13.7%).

21.2% of Lee Green residents live in social rented accommodation, compared to 31.1% in Lewisham as a whole, 24.1% in London, and 17.7% in England. Among Lee Green residents, the three most common types of tenure are Owned (53.7%), Private rented (23.4%), and Social rented (21.2%).

House prices in Lewisham remain lower than those for London as a whole. In 2020, the median house price in the borough was £430,000 compared with £483,000 for Greater London and £249,000 for England.

In terms of relative affordability based on median prices, Lewisham had a median work-place based income to house price ratio in 2020 of 12.3x. Based on median ratios, Lewisham was relatively more affordable than Lambeth, Greenwich and Bromley; and less affordable than Southwark, Croydon, Tower Hamlets and London overall, the South East region and England.

Relative affordability of median prices by local authority area, ONS 2021



Household composition

Of Lee Green's households in 2011, 34.3% were one person households, 53.2% were families and 12.3% other household types, compared to a Lewisham average composition of 34.1% one person household, 51.3% families and 14.4% other household types.






Employment

In the 2011 Census, the unemployment rate in Lee Green was 4.8% among residents aged 16-74, compared to a Lewisham average of 6.3%. 23.5% of residents are not economically active, for example because they are in education, looking after home or family, long-term sick or disabled, or in retirement.

The three most common occupations in Lee Green are Professional occupations (28.4%), Associate professional and technical occupations (17.9%), and Managers, directors and senior officials (12.1%).


Benefit claimants

Universal Credit is the primary social security payment for working-age people with a low household income. It was introduced in 2013 and has gradually replaced six prior benefits: income-based Employment and Support Allowance, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, and Income Support; Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit; and Housing Benefit.


All Universal Credit recipients receive a standard payment that varies by age and whether they live with a partner. Additional payments are offered to help with housing, children and childcare, sickness and disability, and for carers. A further weekly £20 uplift was offered during the COVID-19 pandemic until September 2021.


Health and wellbeing

Census captures different metrics related to a self-assessment of health which can be a useful indicator of the population's general wellbeing and health-related quality of life. These include general health, day-to-day activities limited, and provision of unpaid care.


The average rate of Lee Green residents in very good/good health is 84% compared to a Lewisham average of 81% and a national average of 83%.

Around 6.6% residents of Lee Green had a long term health problem or disability limiting their day to day activities a lot compared to a Lewisham average of 7% and a national average of 8.3%.

Day-to-day activities limited in Lee Green, ONS Census 2011








Around 8.2% of residents in Lee Green provided unpaid care compared to a Lewisham average of 8.1% and a national average of 10.1%.




The average life expectancy at birth for females in Lee Green is 85.2 years compared to England average of 83.2.


Environment

Air quality

The DEFRA 2010 Air Quality Objective sets a target threshold for Nitrogen Dioxide particles in the air at **no more than 40 micrograms**

per cubic metre of air.

This model from 2019 estimates levels based on historical readings at sensor sites, interpolated across the whole of Greater London.




Air quality in Lee Green, London Atmospheric

Car/van availability in Lee Green, ONS Census 2011






Education

Educational attainment

There are nine qualification levels in England: Entry level and then levels 1-9. Levels 1-2 cover GCSE and equivalents, Level 3 covers A level and equivalents, and Levels 4-8 cover higher education equivalents.

In Lee Green, 15% of residents have no qualifications; 9% have Level 1 qualifications; 11% have Level 2 qualifications; 1% have Apprenticeship; 10% have Level 3 qualifications; and 46% have Level 4 qualifications and above.

OFSTED Ratings




Crime


In the period January-December 2021, the number of recorded crimes in Lewisham was 25692 (excluding sexual offences).

Of 991 recorded crimes (Home Office crime classifications, excluding sexual offences) in Lee Green, the three most common offences include violence against the person (303), theft (190) and vehicle offences 165.

In the eight LSOAs in Lee Green, overall crime rates per 1,000 people range from 31.2 to 123.4.


Residents survey

Due to limited data from Lewisham Residents' Survey 2021 at ward level, survey results included in this document are presented at the borough level.

Satisfaction with the Council

Over two thirds (69%) of residents are satisfied with the way Lewisham Council runs things, whilst around 11% are dissatisfied. Satisfaction in Lewisham is significantly higher when compared with LGA October 2021 National data (56%; 13 percentage points).


Satisfaction with how Lewisham Council runs things, Lewisham Residents' Survey 2021
